
PUNARAVARTAN

- POP idols are banned by the Central Pollution Control Board.
- The use of Shaadu idols may grow with the POP ban. However, the addition of a huge quantity of shaadu mati or clay to waterbodies will also be an environmental problem
- The solutions:
 - Install a permanent idol and conduct symbolic immersion, or
 - If you install a shaadu idol, then conduct immersion at home and take the clay for recycling or *punaravartan*.

1) Make available information for awareness creation


- 2) Creative content for circulation

About Punaravartan initiative

- This is a city-wide campaign to collect clay sludge during Ganesh Chaturthi and send it back to artisans
- The intention is to close a gap in the supply chain of clay, which is a reusable material but is currently immersed in waterbodies harming the ecosystem and wasting a natural resource.
- Recycling the clay will help to reduce the mining of fresh clay and also keep the river free of external clay deposits from the Ganesh idols.

- The project is along the same lines of the Nirmalya collection and recycling initiative
- Several organisations and countless individuals are coming together in this collaborative effort including CEE, Swach, Jeevit Nadi, Oikos, eCoexist, Poornam Ecovision Global Shapers and Studio Alternatives, Rotary 3030 and Radio Big FM.
- The project will also be replicated in Nasik by Rotary 3030.
